"IT'S ALL ABOUT LEARNING AND HAVING HIGH EXPECTATIONS OF OURSELVES AND EACH OTHER"

Dear members of the St Columba's community

"Every lesson, students embark on a journey. The fact that they begin their journey from different places, travel at different speeds, in different directions and on different modes of transport presents a considerable challenge for their guide – not least because the education system demands that they all arrive at the same destination at the appointed time."

~Tweak to Transform, Mike Hughes with David Potter

The key principles of learning:

- Learning involves making sense of information.
- Learning involves building on existing understanding.
- Learning takes place at a level just beyond current understanding.

Learning occurs when the penny drops, the light comes on and the learner exclaims, "Ah, I get it!"

The "ah, I get it!" moment involves each individual learner incorporating new information into, and making connections with, their existing understanding and view of thy world. Learning is therefore an active process – a product of doing rather than receiving.

As teachers, part of our role is to create an environment in our classrooms where learning is valued by the learners, your sons and daughters. Our goal, is to ensure that all our students are given the opportunities to experience the "ah I get it!" moment in every lesson throughout the day and in as many different learning contexts. However, the **responsibility** for learning rests with each student.

On Tuesday 9th June, the College will take part in their Annual College Photo Day. The expectation on this day for students is that they dress in full College winter uniform. All College expectations regarding make up, jewellery, hair etc will be enforced throughout the day. Girls must have their hair tied back and off their face. All boys must wear their shirts tucked in, ties done right up and socks must be black, navy blue or grey. All students must have their blazers.

National Reconciliation Week

At our Assembly this week we acknowledged that just over eight years ago the Commonwealth Government apologised on behalf of previous Australian Governments and the Australian people, for the policies and practices of discrimination and hurt that have ultimately resulted in an entrenched sense or racism in many Australian people, toward our indigenous brothers and sisters.

This is a brief excerpt of my address to the students.

"When thinking about this historic moment in our recent history, I found myself wondering, whether anything has really changed?' Are we any further along the path to true reconciliation? Have we changed as a people? Or are we still clinging to the beliefs and prejudices passed onto us from past generations, about a people that few of us have ever really known?

I don't claim to have the answers to these questions, because in truth, they can only be answered by each person individually.

Reconciliation is not a one off experience, but something that each of us must constantly challenge ourselves to be true to, in every relationship we form, not only with those we call friends, but with every single person who lives on this wonderful planet we call earth.

Reconciliation is a heart response to the world we live in. It requires each of us to open ourselves to learn from others and to listen without judgment to someone's understanding and experience of life. This requires great patience and time, to allow all the mysteries of life to unfold, for as it is written in a Nigerian proverb, 'It is the heart that gives, the fingers just let go.'

If there is one lesson that must be learned and reinforced each year that we commemorate, our need as a Nation to reconcile with our indigenous brothers and sisters, it is best summed up in the words of Mother Teresa, "It's easy to love people far away, it's not always easy to love those who live right next to us. There are thousands of people dying all around the world for a bit of bread, but there are thousands more dying for a bit of love, or a bit of acknowledgement. The truth is, that the worse disease today is not

leprosy, tuberculosis or aids, it's being unwanted, it's being left out, it's being forgotten.

At St Columba's Catholic College today, our commitment to our indigenous brothers and sisters should be, that we will never forget them.

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
From the Library


