Learning Interviews

Learning interviews for students in Years 7–10 will take place on the 18th and 25th of May at the College.

These evenings always prove to be very worthwhile for both parents and teachers who appreciate the opportunity to meet with each other and discuss the progress of the students. Information sharing like this is critical in the education of young people and it reinforces for them that their education is a partnership between the College and the home.

If any parent /guardian is unable to attend an interview and would like to speak to their son/daughter's teachers, please ring the College and speak to the appropriate Leader of Mission (Year Co-ordinator) who will arrange for the teachers to contact you.

College Fees

Many people in our community are experiencing financial difficulties due to the high cost of living and a range of other circumstances often beyond their control. I would like to assure all families in our community that we are here to support you in whatever way we can, but in order for us to help and support you, we need for you to tell us.

Parents, our Catholic education system only survives as an alternative education system because fees are charged to cover the shortfall from the Commonwealth and State Government's funding of your child's education. At present this contribution from both Governments, accounts for 80% of the monies needed to fund your son or daughter's education. The shortfall of 20% is raised through school fees, fundraising and donations.

Our process in collecting fees works in this way: All letters are system generated from the Catholic Education Office Parramatta. However, all enquires and issues relating to your child's School Fees are handled by the College:

Letter 1: Our first contact with each family is the School Fees notice, which outlines the schedule of fees. When fees are not paid within the required time frame, an overdue notice is sent out.

Letter 2: If a response is not forthcoming after the overdue notice is sent, a reminder letter is sent out.

Letter 3: Failing to respond at this point in time, results in another letter being sent out from the School Fees Collection Unit at the Catholic Education Office and if this is not responded to by the due date, consultation with the school and your Parish Priest will take place, to ascertain if we are aware of any extenuating circumstances which may be affecting your lack of communication. Failing every avenue to support our families, legal action may need to be taken.

Parents, letters two and three can be avoided if you are experiencing difficulties by contacting the College when the first statement of fees is sent out at the beginning of each term. When this happens, arrangements are discussed with each person privately and confidentially.

At no time will any family be refused an education in our College because of your financial circumstances, however, for us to support anyone who is experiencing difficulty in paying school fees we must be informed.

If any family is experiencing difficulty paying school fees please contact **Mr Chris Carpenter our Business Manager** immediately. I can assure you that you will be always be treated with the utmost dignity and respect.

National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy 2016

LETTER TO PARENTS

In May 2016 the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN has the support of all State and Territory Education Ministers and will assess the literacy and numeracy skills of students across Australian schools.

The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard.

Student background information (student name, gender, date of birth, language background and Aboriginality) will be collected as part of the National Assessment Program. This information is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that every student's right to privacy is maintained.

The NAPLAN tests will be conducted from 10-12 May 2016.

In the Numeracy tests students do not require any measuring tools such as rulers or protractors. In Years 7 and 9 there will be two Numeracy tests: one where a calculator is allowed and one where calculators are not to be used. For the calculator test, the student should use the calculator that they currently use at school.

Friday 13 May - A 'catch-up' day is scheduled for students who missed a test or were absent on a test day.

Students may be considered for exemption from the tests if they:

- are newly arrived in Australia (less than one year before the test) and with a language background other than English, or
- have significant intellectual disability and/or significant co-existing conditions which severely limit their capacity to participate in the tests.

All other students are expected to participate in the tests. Disability adjustments which reflect the student's normal level of support in the classroom may be provided. Large print, Braille, coloured paper versions and electronic tests are available to meet the needs of individual students.

Access to disability adjustments or exemption from the tests must be discussed with the school principal and a parent or carer consent form must be signed.

Students may be withdrawn from NAPLAN by their parent or carer. This is a matter for consideration by parents in consultation with the school principal. If you wish to withdraw your child from the tests, a parent or carer consent form must be signed.

Please make an appointment with the principal of the school your child attends if you would like to discuss your child's participation in NAPLAN.

Fees are payable in accordance with the Diocesan School Fees Policy which states "all fees are due and payable within 30 days of the date the school account statement is issued". Outstanding accounts will be forwarded to Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, for actioning.

headspace Fathers Campaign

87 per cent of young men with mental health issues do not seek out help

Friday April 22, 2016

Fathers and sons of Australia, it's time to talk.

The stigma surrounding men, young and old, opening up about their struggles with mental illness is a nation-wide problem.



With the forthcoming ANZAC Day remembrance looming, it's a timely reminder that previous generations of Australian men often had nowhere to turn to talk about their worries.

This is not the case in 2016.

headspace is proud to launch a striking new national campaign aimed at assisting fathers to support their sons through mental health challenges.

The campaign focus is to help open up the mental health conversation between those fathers and sons who may not know how to start it.

headspace CEO Chris Tanti said a lot of things go unsaid between young men and their dads, especially when it comes to mental health.

"In past generations men were sometimes reluctant to open up about mental health issues," he said.

"Fathers can play a vital role in identifying the early signs of mental illness and helping their sons get the support they need but many men are unsure how to start the conversation or what services are available."

"Studies have shown that only 13 per cent of young men with mental health issues seek out professional help. It's time that we changed this."

This statistic is backed up by the fact that young men are accessing headspace at a lower rate than women. In 2014/15, 61 per cent of those accessing headspace centres were female, while 38 per cent were male (1 per cent identified as other).

headspace provides face-to-face support at its more than 90 centres across Australia as well as online and telephone information and support to young people and their family and friends.

The headspace website also provides fathers with tips about how to approach important conversations with their son and how to be proactive in supporting their son's mental health.






