Dear members of the St Columba's community

I hope this newsletter finds your family safe and well. Unfortunately, Mr Ryan is unwell. He returned to school Monday and Tuesday but unfortunately had a recurrence of his illness. He has been advised to stay off on sick leave and we hope to see him return to work in Week 7. We pray for his good health. During this time Mr Malone will continue as the Acting Assistant Principal and I will continue as Acting Principal.

We also thank both Miss Nyburg for continuing to lead in the role of Head of PDHPE/Sport and Miss Gawthorne for continuing to assume the role of Assistant Leader of Learning PDHPE and Sport. Both have undertaken these positions over the last five weeks and will continue to do so during this next fortnight.

A huge congratulations to both Mr Skinner, who has been promoted to Assistant Principal at Gilroy Catholic College, Castle Hill from the beginning of 2017 onwards, and to Mr Malone, who has also been promoted to the Assistant Principal role at Xavier Catholic College, Llandilo from the beginning of 2017. We are all incredibly proud of the way they have served our community and know they will be wonderful leaders in their new schools.

St Columba's is a place of learning and we have high expectations of ourselves and of one another. The learning happens everywhere for our students and staff, in and outside of our classrooms. Last week we welcomed our new Year 7 2017 students and their families to our College at an information night and then they came for an orientation day last Friday. Many of our teachers and Year 10 students volunteered their time to welcome our new students and take them to sample lessons in various KLAs. There was so much energy and excitement. I loved watching our older students care for the younger students, and at lunchtime it was lovely to watch our students come and find their siblings or old primary school friends or neighbours and say "Hello."

Last Friday was also the Year 12 formal at the Fairmont Resort where Mrs Mulhall commented how proud she was of our 146 students who have now finished successfully. Everyone had a beautiful night of celebration and it was so wonderful to watch the year group, their parents and teachers dance and laugh, enjoying one another's company. I laugh everytime the 'Nutbush' plays and students know the dance moves. I think our parents have taught them these moves, as I remember PDHPE classes where we had to learn this dance when I was at school so many years ago.

Ms Salloum told me today how excited Year 10 are for their dinner dance at Panthers on Wednesday 30th November and know that the students will have a wonderful time together. I also wanted to add, how proud we are of our students who have made new students so welcome to the Year 10 group.

Observing our future students getting excited to begin their secondary education at St Columba's and then the mixed, happy emotions of our Year 12's celebrating their friendships and achievements, I can't help reflect upon our current students who are working hard in their everyday learning and I want to tell you how wonderful it is to do "learning walks" and regularly visit classrooms in our college.

Every classroom has learning intentions visible on the board, TV, projector, Edmodo or written learning task. This learning intention is a statement to explain to the students what they are going to learn. Students know what knowledge, skills and understandings that the teacher is trying to help them learn. Teachers also write up the success criteria (which communicates to students how they can judge their learning progression and how the teacher will evaluate if they have achieved the learning intention). Subject specific terminology is also listed and learning preparation is included in the lesson. Everyday students are reminded at the end-of-day announcement to complete their learning preparation so they are developing successful study habits to revise their work and reinforce what they have learnt during the day.

If you look into your child's diary, they are encouraged to use the left hand side of their diary to list every subject of the day and include a brief reminder of what they need to complete before their next lesson. If you have a moment, have a conversation with your child and look at their diary to observe how they are organising their diary with regards to the learning preparation. This may give you an indication of their attitude towards their learning and how their self-efficacy is developing.

Self-efficacy is your belief in your own abilities to deal with situations. This belief determines how we think, behave and feel. By using organisational tools like the college diary, practising sitting down to complete learning preparation regularly and experiencing accomplishment, our students develop self-efficacy and belief in their ability that they can achieve success.

As we all know, the proudest moments in our life are when we have worked hard to achieve a goal. When facing a challenge, does your child wait to be told what to do, avoid the task, lose confidence in their ability and you find yourself doing the work with them? When facing a challenge, do they rise up and try or do they give up in defeat if no one helps them or do they blame others?

Learning how to organise ourselves minimises stress so that when we do face difficult tasks or challenging situations, we develop a belief in our abilities and we gain a 'can do' attitude that we can achieve the goals that we set for ourselves.

Each person is blessed with God-given gifts and talents. Our role as parents and teachers is to challenge our children to believe in themselves, develop their knowledge, skills and talents and know how loved they are by all of us.

If you are ever concerned about your child's development at our college, call their subject teacher or subject Leader of Learning, Homeroom teacher or Leader of Mission and we will work with you and your child to support the learning. Please don't hesitate to share with your child's teachers any information that will help us support your child and if our teachers have not been able to help, please call anyone on the Executive Leadership Team. Our receptionist will direct your call if you are unsure.

School travel 2017

Application information Nov 2016

Information for parents, guardians and students

Our school has partnered with Transport for NSW to use the new online process for you to submit school travel applications.

This means we will be able to process your applications online, making it easier and faster for parents, guardians and students to apply for school travel.

Applications for school travel in 2017 are now open, including for travel to Mascot and Green Square station and for private ferries. Parents, guardians and students are encouraged to apply as soon as they are able via:

Applications for 2017 school travel are now open via www.transportnsw.info/school-students

A new application is required when:

- applying for a School Opal card or travel pass for the first time,
- enrolling in Kindergarten, or
- requesting an additional entitlement as a result of a shared parental responsibility situation.

You will need to do an update application if the student has a current school travel pass and:

- is progressing from Year 2 to Year 3,
- is progressing from Year 6 to Year 7, or
- changes address, or
- changes school or campus.

Already have a School Opal card or travel pass?

- When you've updated, and you are eligible for free school travel next year, Transport
 for NSW will send you an email confirmation once your application has been
 processed. For travel in rural or regional NSW, we'll also inform your nominated
 transport operator(s).
- If you already have a School Opal card that does not need updating, or you've successfully re-applied, the Opal card will automatically be updated for travel next year. Do not throw it out as you'll be able to use it when the school year starts in 2017.
- If you currently have a printed travel pass provided by your transport operator, a new pass will be will be ready at the beginning of the new school year.
