
The school fee collection process has commenced on overdue accounts that have not been addressed as above.

Wall of Hands

On Friday, 16th September, staff and students alike wore red, yellow and black clothing to support the Aboriginal Literacy and Numeracy fundraiser, the Wall of Hands. The ALNF's goal this year was to raise \$600,000 and it was very satisfying to know that we played a part in achieving this.

Some of the students made delicious cakes that were decorated to reflect Indigenous art. As one of the students said, they were too beautiful to cut, but once the deed was done, the students lined up and we sold out very quickly.

The chocolate cakes were particularly popular.

At lunchtime, students and staff painted their hands and placed them on their House Walls. Our students are incredibly creative; the patterns they produced reflected this. It was wonderful to watch them painting each other's hands and to see their smiles as they saw the finished results. The Walls will be up for the rest of this term.

We raised \$1100 to help close the gap between Indigenous literacy and numeracy levels and that of the rest of Australia. This is particularly important for Indigenous children in rural and remote parts of Australia.

Thank you to all the staff and students who made such an effort to make this a success.

PDHPE: Linking physical activity to improved academic performance

A growing body of evidence-based research suggests that regular exercise and physical activity significantly improves children and young people's cognitive abilities and academic performance, in addition to the immediate and long-term health and wellbeing benefits they experience.

Research suggests children and young people who are more physically active are better able to focus their attention on tasks, have improved working memory, are quicker to perform simple tasks, and have better problem solving skills than those who are less active.

Schools play an important role in developing the knowledge, skills and attitudes young people need to adopt an active lifestyle, where physical activity is a regular and valued part of their daily lives. The mandatory PDHPE K–10 syllabus acknowledges the link between the cognitive and physical components of health.

In PDHPE Years 7-10, students explore:

- the interaction of cognitive, physical, social, emotional and spiritual components of health
- physical activity levels for health and fitness
- participation in lifelong physical activities and the potential benefits
- the benefits of a balanced lifestyle that includes rest, sleep and physical activity
- a range of positive management strategies to support good health eg yoga, relaxation, physical activity and listening to music.

It was a fantastic day!



A GROUP of girls thrown into a team for the Western Sydney Wanderers Schools Cup gala day went on to be champions of their division.


