School Fees

The school fee statements for Term 1, 2016 have been mailed out. The due date for payment is on or before Monday 7th March 2016. If you have not yet received your statement, please contact me on 4754 8902 to arrange for a copy to be sent home.

The cutoff date for returning the required paperwork for the payment of the 2016 school fees by way of Flexible Payment Plan to the Catholic Education Office, Parramatta, was 26^{th} February. The Catholic Education Office will not accept late requests. If you would like to pay the 2016 fees as per the amounts shown on the Flexible Payment Plan paperwork, you need to contact me as soon as possible so that I am able to set the arrangement up for you.

Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, is committed to supporting families experiencing genuine financial hardship. If you are having difficulties with the payment of your school fees, you are encouraged to contact the school office to arrange an appointment with either me or the business manager to discuss payment options. Your situation will be treated with care and confidentiality and an appropriate payment arrangement will be made for you. Please note that as part of this process you may be required to complete a Statement of Financial Position so that the school is aware of your current financial situation. Please be assured of **complete confidentiality** with regards to any information you are asked to provide.

N.B. If you were on a payment arrangement for 2015 (except Flexible Payment Plan) it is important that you contact me when you receive your Term 1 statement so that I am aware of your intentions for 2016.

Please be advised that unless alternative arrangements have been made regarding the payment of your account it will be assumed that full payment will be made on or before the due date. Fees are payable in accordance with the Diocesan School Fees Policy which states "all fees are due and payable within 30 days of the date the school account statement is issued". Outstanding accounts will be forwarded to Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, for actioning.



Vicky Little is a passionate and professional disability advocate, trainer and mentor with over 10 years' experience in the field of Autism in the UK and Australia. Her experience includes developing and coordinating specialist graduate and student support programs across southern England at Prospects in London, the UK's National Autistic Society's employment support service. These programs offered employment preparation and transition support for students and graduates with Autism Spectrum Disorder's, as well as provided specialist training for employers and Higher Education institutes across the UK.

In 2011, Vicky brought her skills and experience back to Australia by founding AS Capable, a specialist mentoring and training service supporting adults with autism into employment, whilst simultaneously pursuing her interest in tertiary education as Disability Services Officer at Sydney University for 3 years. In June 2014, AS Capable partnered with Autism Spectrum Australia (Aspect) to launch NSW's first autism specific employment service, Aspect Capable. Now the Employment Coordinator at Aspect, Vicky pursues her passion of raising awareness of the strengths and capabilities of adults with autism and enabling them to thrive within the workforce.


