NAPLAN 2018 Week 3

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will this year be sitting for a battery of tests designed for the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy in Week 3.

Testing will take place over three days, with all students across Australia being assessed on the following days:

Tuesday May 15: Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation); Writing

Wednesday May 16: Reading Thursday May 17: Numeracy

There will be a 'catch up' day on Friday May 18 for any student who was

unable to do their tests on the nominated day.

Parents, you will receive feedback about your son or daughter's performance in August, which will indicate to you how you child performed in the tests compared to other students across Australia. This report will also indicate:

Whether or not your child achieved the National benchmark in reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy

What band your child achieved in reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy

What the National average was for students in reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy.







THE TRUTH ABOUT THE ATAR

There's been lots of media attention on the ATAR recently and not all of the commentary has been accurate and well-informed.

Dr Rod Yager, Chair of the Technical Committee on Scaling, which is responsible for calculating ATARs, says recent commentary overlooks evidence that students who choose the more demanding maths and English options get higher ATARs than those who choose the easier options.

For instance, looking at students who were placed in the 80th percentile in the 2013 NAPLAN numeracy tests, the students from this percentile group who went on to study Mathematics in the HSC had an average scaled score of 60.3 across their other subjects. The students from the same percentile group who chose to study Mathematics General had an average scaled score of 55.7 across their other subjects. The same phenomenon occurs with the 2013 NAPLAN literacy scores and choice of English subject.

Dr Yager believes this illustrates that there are many factors which are far more important in determining student success than subject choice. 'The support and encouragement that students receive from their teachers, schools and families to pursue the more demanding options, together with their own desire to be challenged and well prepared for their future, are the real keys to better outcomes.'

TRANSPARENCY

A reminder that new transparency measures are being implemented for the coming admissions year. This means that all universities and admissions centres across Australia will adopt a standard approach when providing information to students about admissions criteria and processes.

You'll see that certain terms will be changed, the most notable being:

- 'bonus points' will be replaced by 'adjustment factors'
- 'course 'cut-off' will be replaced with lowest selection rank.

You'll also see changes in how course information is presented. Universities will also be required to publish the minimum, median and top ATAR mark (without any adjustments) of an applicant to whom an offer of a place was

made, as well as the minimum, median and top selection rank (including any adjustment factors) of an applicant to whom an offer of a place was made.

You'll see these measures adopted in all UAC publications, on UAC's website, including in the course descriptions and the UAC app.

EAS IS GOING ONLINE

For this first time this year, Educational Access Schemes applications are going online and will become part of an applicant's UAC application.

Once applicants have submitted their undergraduate application, they'll have the option to immediately access the EAS application via the 'Apply for EAS' button, or they can log back in to their undergraduate application at any time and apply for EAS.

Applicants will be able to download the necessary forms, including the educational impact statement form, and then upload their completed application when done.

UMAT (UNDERGRADUATE MEDICINE AND HEALTH SCIENCES ADMISSION TEST) REGISTRATION REMINDER

UMAT is used specifically to help with the selection of students into medicine, dentistry and some health science degree programs at undergraduate level.

The test assesses general attributes and skills gained through prior experience and learning, such as critical thinking and problem solving, interactions with others, and abstract non-verbal reasoning.

UMAT is only held once a year and a reminder that registrations close on 1 June 2018. UMAT will be held on 25 July 2018.
