Dear members of the St Columba's community

The Hawkesbury Road Fire and Emergency Project

The College proudly hosted representatives from 11 local State, Catholic and Independent schools and 4 Emergency Services Agencies yesterday, in order to participate in the Hawkesbury Road Fire and Emergency Project.



The project provided the

opportunity for all schools to review their emergency procedures with expert advice and support from the local emergency service agencies to ensure our preparedness for the bushfire season.

I was delighted to be told that our policies and procedures were considered to be best practice in light of the emergency scenarios presented by the Police, Fire Brigade, RFS and SES personnel present.

It was very reassuring to know that our experience in protecting our students during the 2013 fires and our ongoing review of our procedures, has enabled the College to create a Fire and Emergency Procedures Policy that will ensure that that our students and staff will be safe if another fire occurs in and around the College.

Today we had a rehearsal of our "Sit and Stay" procedures and our "Shelter in Place" procedures to ensure that all students and staff are aware of what they are to do in the event of an emergency. These emergency drills are essential and we will continue to rehearse our students and staff throughout the coming months.

Are you prepared?

Parents do you have a plan in place for your children in the event of the Great Western Highway being closed, or if your home is cut off by bushfires or another emergency event while you are at work and away from the Mountains?

Hands off

The "Hands Off" policy was introduced in the College from the time the College began in 1979 to ensure that the students at all times were safe from any unwanted, unsolicited and unnecessary advances from other students.

Throughout this year the students have been constantly reminded of their obligation to respect our code of conduct for all students at the College. Unfortunately, in regard to this policy many students have ignored or defied the teachers.

In our learning environment we have an obligation to ensure that our students respect the rights of one another in regard to personal space and that they are prepared for the world of work, where unwanted advances are considered to be sexual harassment and often result in employees being fired from their jobs.

Parents, I ask you please to support us in our endeavour to ensure that all students feel safe and secure here at the College.

Social networking sites and texting

Parents, please monitor the amount of Learning Preparation (LP) that each student should be completing each night, as a number of students are presenting each day with their LP not completed.

Students who have been interviewed about their study habits have openly admitted to the fact that rather than completing their LP they are spending anywhere between 3 to 10 hours on social networking sites.

I have two concerns regarding this issue; firstly, the students are not coming prepared for their learning and this is having a direct result on their learning. Secondly, social networking sites are not a problem, but do you as parents know who and what is being spoken about and what your sons and daughters are putting on these sites?

Of late we have had to deal directly with the police regarding students involved in some very unsafe and illegal activities while they are on some of these sites.

Could I remind all parents and guardians that every piece of research written about how best to protect your children while on the internet states very simply, that time on the internet and mobile phone should be limited and in full sight of parents and guardians. The recommended place for students to work or be engaged on their computers is in the family room or the kitchen.

Parents, could I ask that you regularly check the sites your son or daughter is visiting on their computers, paying particular attention to the profile page that they have set up, where a lot of extremely private information is being posted for anyone to see and use.

NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM 2018

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

Parent Information Kits that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to parents/guardians at the beginning of 2018.

In 2018 the following vaccine will be offered FREE to Year 10 and 11 students:

Meningococcal ACWY vaccine as a single dose

To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- read all the information provided
- complete the consent form, including signing their name next to the vaccine/s they would like their child to receive
- return the completed consent form to their child's school as soon as possible

To improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses throughout 2018 where possible.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at:

www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation.

- Ensure that your child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.
- A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at the clinic as a physical card.
- Parents/guardians should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.


Oliver Smuhar: The Gifts of Life Book Launch


Editor's Review: Synopsis

In the world of Oberon, there are cities characterised by the landscape surrounding them and the people within them, just as in the real world. The lands traversed by its inhabitants vary greatly the further they travel: vast, concrete cities adorned with white marble and pristine lawns, the neverending stretch of desert full of people equally as harsh as the land they live on, and lush green rainforests home to caves and animals of all descriptions. But that is where the similarities stop. In this unique universe created by one of Australia's up-and-coming (not to mention one of its youngest) authors, each city hosts a beacon—a powerful light source that awakens the powers of the individuals connected to them through the crests imprinted on their arms from birth. Power, especially great power, however, can become a burden, as Perry Caduca and his friends discover.

As Perry, his younger sister Teala, his best friend Faith, and the family servant, Bailey, prepare for the Ascension Ceremony, the yearly gathering to celebrate the switching on of Kelton Whide's beacon, Perry realises that something is amiss. He, Teala, Faith and Bailey are chased out of town by a villain in a white suit by the name of Araidian, along with his sadistic, heavily-armed followers and a giant flying creature resembling a pterodactyl, it becomes clear that whatever it is definitely isn't good. Forced to flee their hometown for the safety of Everbreen, a rainforest haven a month's walk away, Perry has to work out a way to reconcile himself with the looming threat of Araidian and his men as well as his now ever-present powers and the darkness they hold.

The book isn't all dark though; the friendship that develops between Perry, Faith, Teala and Bailey, along with the other people they meet along the way, serve to alleviate some of the more graphic scenes (one of which includes a situation in which two kids are forced to fight to the death with a kitchen knife). There are also some pretty cool characters with some fairly original powers, including a salesman whose special power is to vomit up objects for his store. It's also nice to see the use of the Australian landscape developed into a unique fantasy universe, something which is very original to this novel.

Smuhar's book is a shining example of dark YA fantasy that keeps you guessing until the very end—think Deltora Quest meets the Hunger Games with an awesome hybrid dragon creature made of smoke thrown in for good luck. Sadly though, we'll have to wait until the next book to find out what happens to Perry and his newfound animal friends and to discover the gift from the man in the boat.

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



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Dove Tales goes Graphic

This term the St Columba's book club, Dove Tales, has decided to make reading graphic novels its focus.

Graphic novels are often much maligned as 'not real books' as they primarily send their messages through image and illustration rather than the written word. The aim of the book club's focus is to remove this stigma and show just how exciting and interesting graphic novels can be. I think the thing to remember is that the novel, which is widely considered serious reading material now, was once frowned upon as frivolous and a waste of time, scorned by academia and learned men.

At our last Dove Tales meeting we discussed the types of graphic novels available to the reading community. These include adaptations of prose texts, often classics or popular novel; manga, the Japanese form of the type; comic books; and stand alone texts. The library has recently acquired a range of new graphic novel texts, and Mrs Sefton, our librarian, is always looking for suggestions of new texts to purchase. At our next meeting students will be reviewing the books they have read from the library's catalogue and we will publish some of these in the next newsletter.
