Recently, we had the wonderful opportunity to study in Japan as part of the long-running exchange program between St Columba's and Hokusetsu Sanda Senior High School. Over five months, we immersed ourselves in Japanese culture, customs and daily life. Our Japanese language ability has greatly improved as a result of this exchange, opening up a myriad of opportunities for us both here in Australia and in Japan. Everyone we met in the Land of the Rising Sun was incredibly kind, helpful and generous, making our stay an absolute pleasure. Staying with a variety of host families gave us a unique insight into modern Japanese life, and helped us establish connections that will last a lifetime. As we lived there for a long period of time, we were able to see a great deal of this fascinating nation, but there is still so much more to discover. We had many fascinating experiences during our stay, such as travelling to the ancient city of Kyoto and eating tasty udon noodles on the island of Shikoku. As part of the exchange, we attended Hokusetsu Sanda Senior High School, a school renowned throughout the country. A normal school day in Japan was extraordinary as we experienced interesting, and enjoyable subjects such as tea ceremony and calligraphy lessons. Not only did we participate in additional unfamiliar subjects, but we also had the chance to try some of the many dedicated after-school club activities, such as basketball, baseball and traditional Japanese chess. This exchange was a life-changing experience and one that we will never forget. We both look forward to returning in the future, and highly recommend trying the exchange program if you have a desire to experience a dramatically different culture and lifestyle.






